Used Items that our class can Upcycle!

Plastic containers (and their lids) from:

- Spices
- Dry-roasted peanuts (please wash carefully for those who may have allergies)
- Vinegar
- Drinks LESS than 2 L
- Any similar sized quart container that was not used for hazardous items

Plastic Lids from almost any kind of jar – especially deeper ones that were twist on. Lids from milk cartons that are the twist on kind (not so much the pop off ones).

Wood:

- Paint stir sticks
- Popsicle sticks
- Wood scraps that are less than 3' long

NO treated wood, please!

Miscellaneous:

- Coated Paper containers such as quart or half gallon milk or half-and-half. Especially with the plastic pour spout (don't forget the cap!)
 - Brass swivel hook-to-line connectors (for you fishermen) *** these can be used on almost every project!
 - Metal Washers – any size
 - Belts (like you might use on a vacuum cleaner, not the kind that hold up your pants)
 - Springs – from pens, doors, etc.
 - Styrofoam (or similar) packing – not the popcorn, but formed or sheet pieces used to make items snug in their boxes
 - Roll cores from aluminum foil (send in that useless last 3" of scrap foil, too!), wax paper, tape, any rolled item with a stiff core
 - Chip board – this is the stiff back piece from a pad of paper
 - Duct tape – printed, plain, colored – doesn't matter
 - Binder clips, clothes pins, chip clips
 - Velcro
 - Old umbrellas
 - Eyeglasses
 - Kitchen utensils – wooden spoons, tongs, forks, etc.
 - Small appliances – do not need to work (no microwaves)
 - Twine, string, thread
 - Thread spools
 - Screening (wire or poly mesh)
 - Pulleys (think...old blinds – the cords, too)
 - Anything with gears
